They were Sipet's favorite.

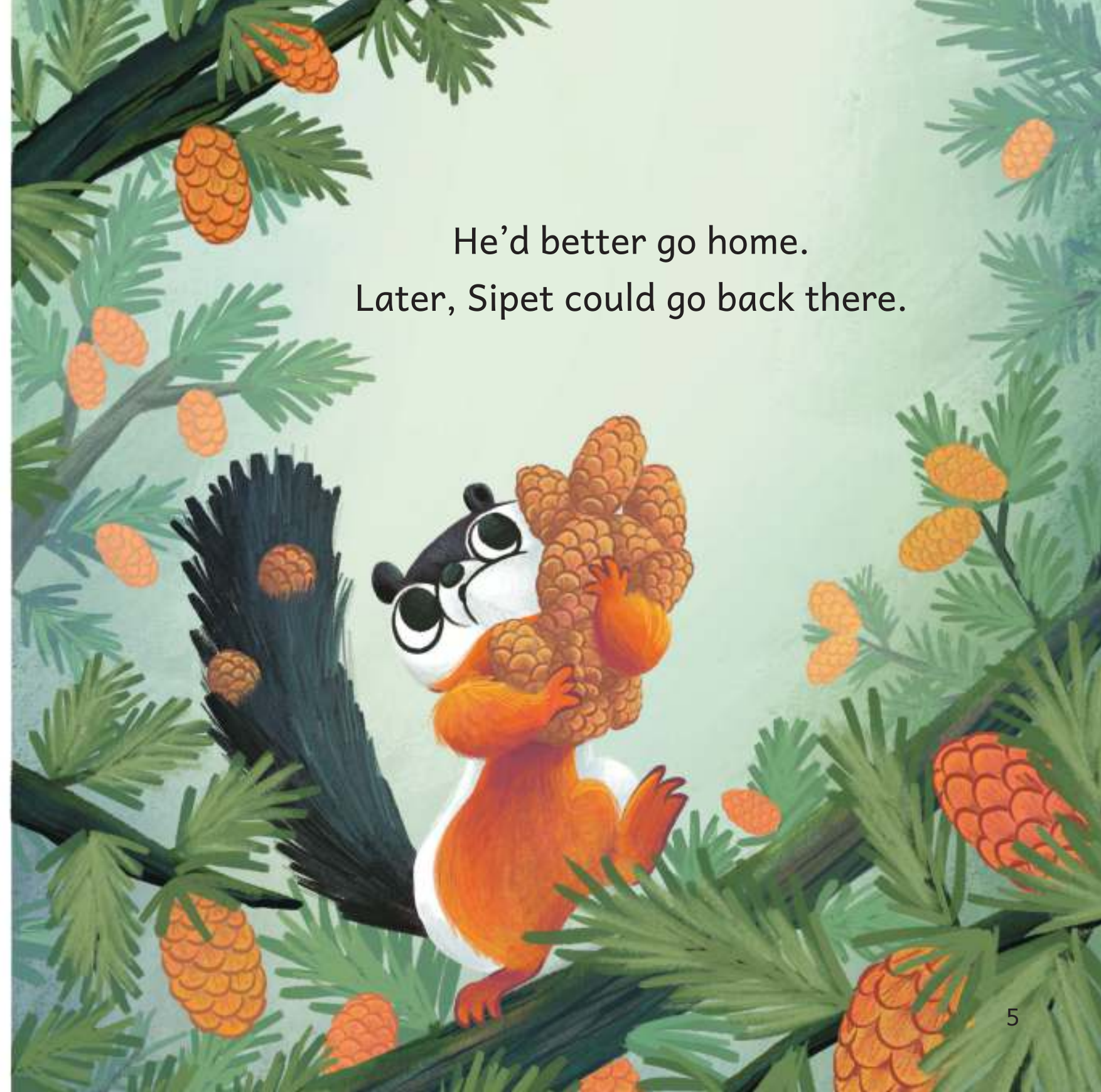
They were scrumptious!

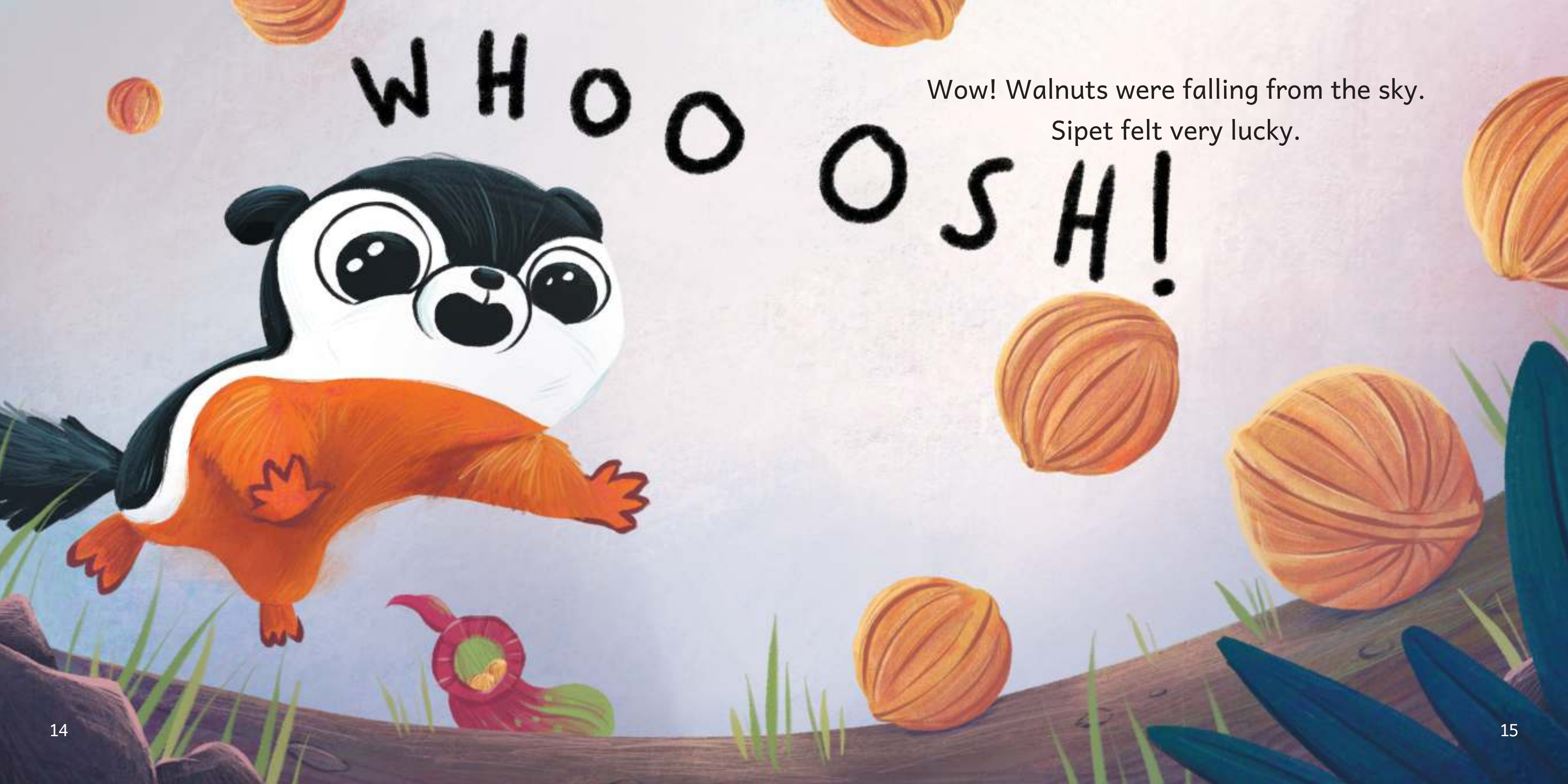
Sipet's nuts fell

Sipet sat on something. It was Sipet's pine nuts. Ugh, Sipet must really clean his house.

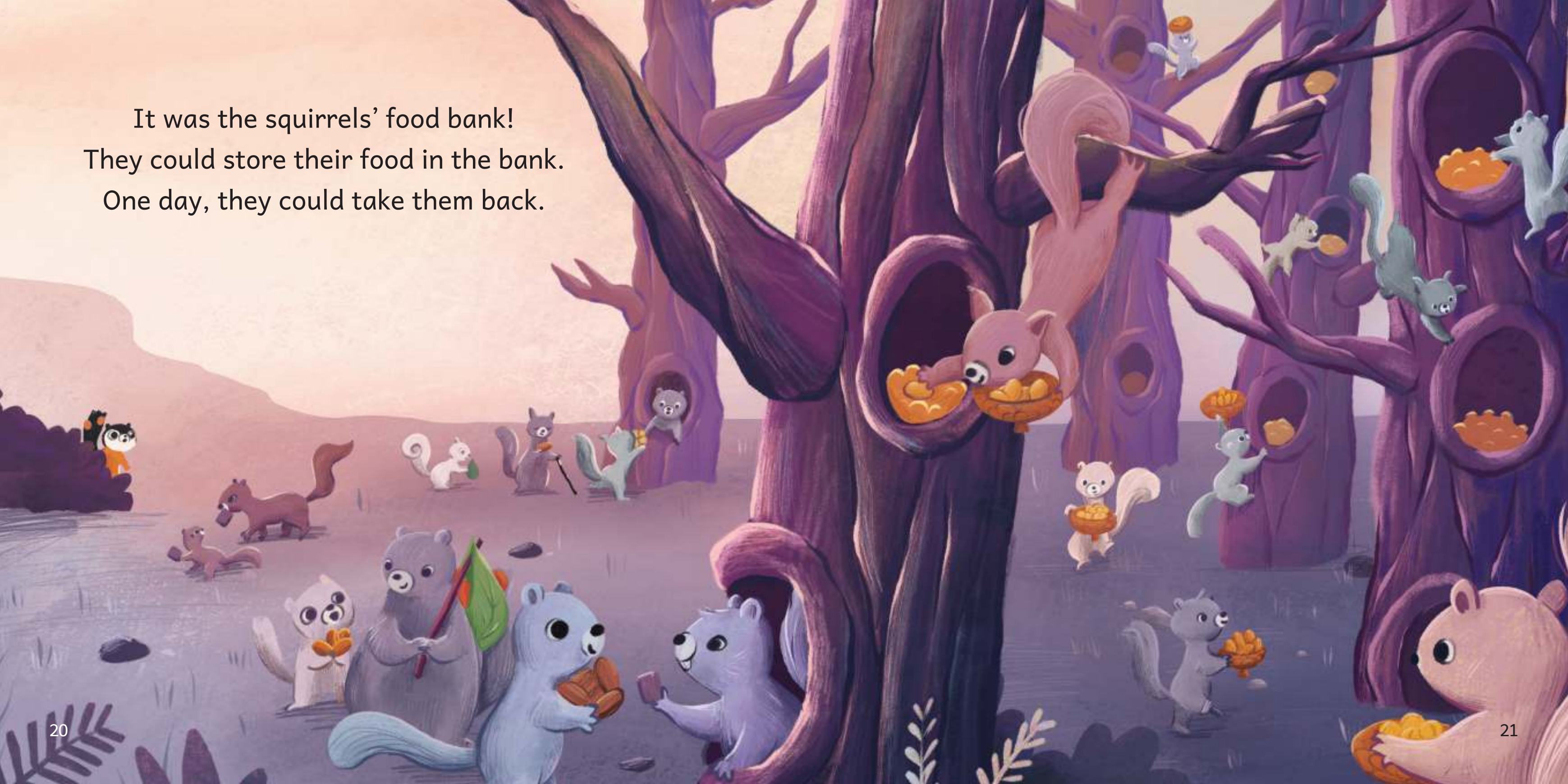


Sipet was getting ready to gather some more food. Hey, he saw his friends again. This time Sipet followed them.

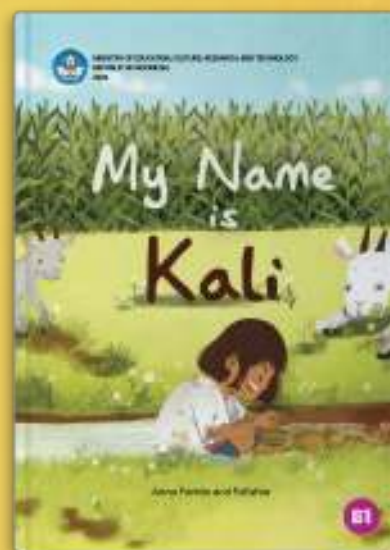


**Designer**
